- 2. Road to Hāna: The scenic drive along the eastern coast, with waterfalls and hairpin turns, is a must-do adventure.
- Molokini Crater: Just off Maui's coast, Molokini is a popular spot for snorkeling and diving in clear waters.
- 4. Whale Watching: Maui is a premier destination for whale watching, with humpbacks migrating to warm waters annually.
- 5. Iao Valley: Iao Valley State Park boasts lush Iandscapes and the iconic Iao Needle.
- 6. Surfing in Paia: Paia on the North Shore is a renowned surfing capital with consistent waves.
- 7. Haleakalā Silversword: Haleakalā hosts the rare Haleakalā silversword plant, known for its unique appearance.
- 8. Lavender Farms: Explore picturesque lavender farms like Ali'i Kula for scenic views and vibrant blooms.
- 9. Paniolo Culture: Maui embraces paniolo (cowboy) culture, celebrated at events like the Makawao Rodeo.
- 10. Haleakalā Sunrise: Catching the sunrise at Haleakalā's summit is a breathtaking and popular experience.
